Union Pacific Railroad, completed on May 10, 1869, allowed settlers to make the trip west in just seven days. The trip previously took up to six months via wagon, and was a perilous journey for the settlers.

This National Historic Landmark signifies the merging of the Central Pacific Railroad with the Union Pacific Railroad in Promontory, Utah. The two railroads were joined by the driving of a final golden spike.
