February Geotechnical Section Meeting and Geo-Omaha Conference

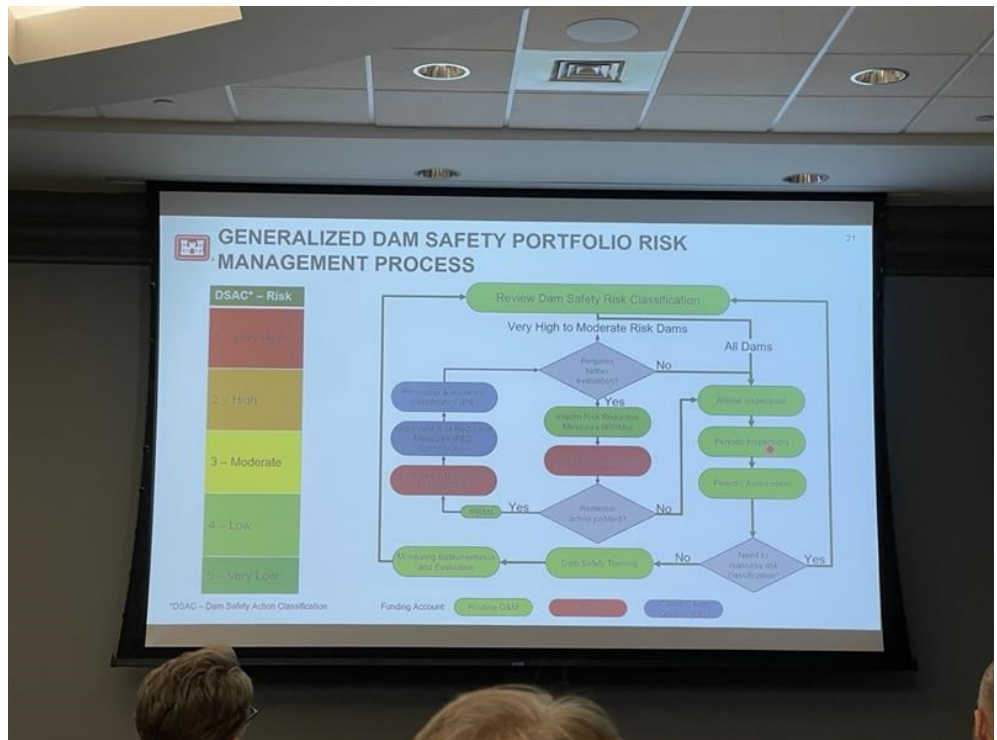
On February 6th, 2025, the Nebraska ASCE Geotechnical committee hosted the February Section Meeting at the Scott Conference Center at the University of Nebraska Lincoln. The meeting topic focused on Assessing the Future Legacy of Northwester USACE Dams and was presented by the following industry professionals:

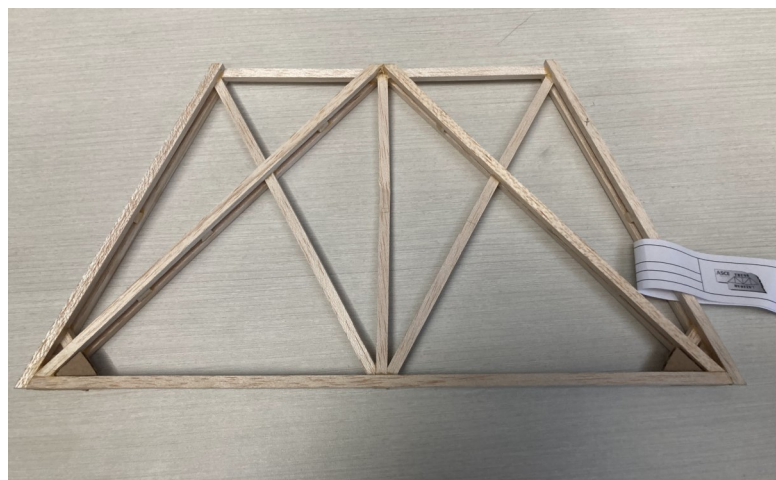
Future Cities Competition—Washington DC

Future City is a hands-on cross-curricular educational program that brings STEM to life for students in grades 6 through 8. Using the Engineering Design Process (EDP) and project management skills, students showcase their solutions to a citywide sustainability issue. This year's challenge asked students to build a floating city that keeps its citizens safe and healthy. The Nebraska regional competition was held on January 15th and had over 100 students compete from 9 different schools including Waverly, Louisville, Fort Calhoun, and Arlington. The winning team from Waverly Middle School recently traveled to Washington DC the weekend of February 14th to participate in the National Competition. The team represented Nebraska very well!

UNO poured their concrete canoe on Monday, February 24th.

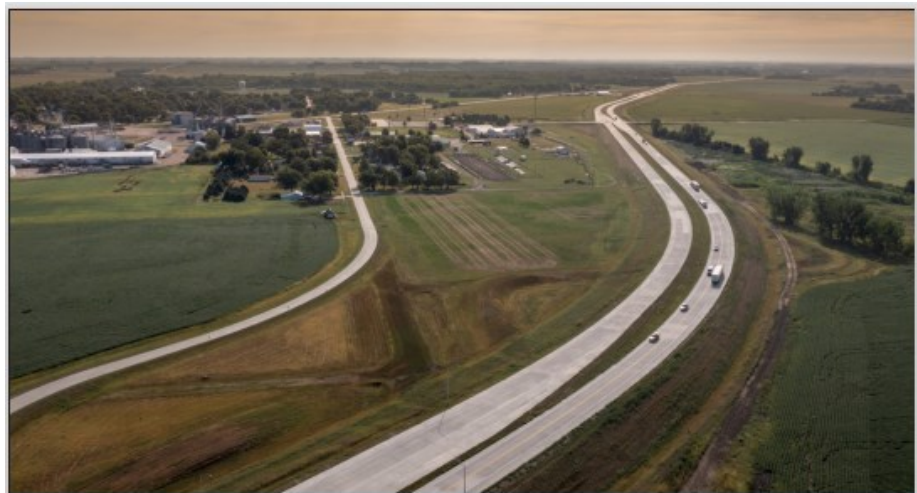


MRLC in Cleveland, Ohio
